
About the Author




About the Author


About the Author





Whether it's the soothing Temperance card telling you *You Need To Calm Down*, the Lovers card hinting that it might be time to begin your own *Love Story*, or The Magician card encouraging that it really is within your power to change *The Prophecy*, this deck will connect the insight of Tarot reading with fan favourite Taylor Swift songs, and serve as a beautiful reminder as to why Taylor herself has become an honorary 'big sister' to Swifties across the globe through the power of her songwriting.





































Jess Hayman



> The earliest parasols were made, in ancient Egypt and other places, from feathers and plants.

At first, parasols made from paper were only used to shade people from the sun. Then it was discovered that painting paper with oil made it water-resistant, which was very handy for those drizzly days.

Later, silk was used to make parasols. Often only very powerful people like emperors and chiefs used silk umbrellas. Some were very fancy indeed!

Umbrellas in Europe were first made with whalebone but, luckily for whales, Samuel Fox invented umbrellas made with steel in 1852.



James Smith & Sons was the first shop in London to stock Samuel Fox's steelribbed umbrellas.



This shop has been trading since 1830.

UMBRELLAS

You can find these colourful umbrellas in Tsujikura, a shop in Kyoto, Japan, where umbrellas and parasols have been sold since 1690. You can buy a wagasa (an umbrella), a higasa (a parasol, to protect you from the sun) or even a maigasa (a parasol to dance with). They are made using Japanese paper, which is produced in a variety of beautiful colours and patterns.

It has been called an Auntie Ella, a gamp, a gambershoot, a storm stick, a bumbershoot and a rain napper!


Laura Hole

Tom McLaughlin


















Catherine Rayner
