





In the city of Fathach, giant hunters are equivalent to local heroes. For, as everybody knows, giants are wild, violent, senseless creatures...aren't they?

13-year-old Jacq Dyer is the daughter of two renowned giant hunters – although she's never had much stomach for what they do. After her mother, Cassie, disappeared on a hunt six months ago, Jacq has been sorting through her grief and confusion all alone. And the pain of losing a parent is still fresh for young Under Hill giant Corman, whose father has just been taken by human hunters.

The Golem's Eye (#2)


